The Foot Care Nurse works autonomously in the provision of appropriate foot care services, including assessment, nursing interventions and documentation, while working collaboratively with the physicians to develop, implement and evaluate care plans.

Education/Experience:

- Completion of an accredited Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) education program.
- Completion of an accredited Advanced Foot Care program.
- Current registered member in good standing with the College and Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta (CLPNA).
- 3-5 years experience in a nursing capacity, with Advanced Foot Care experience preferred.
- Experience in community-based care is an asset.
- Working knowledge of Diabetic disease process and relevant health issues affecting mobility.
